GOD'S WATCHERS

In the ancient world watchmen were extremely important people. They kept communities safe, and were there to alert them to any impending danger or attack. Before locks, alarms, and security systems, watchmen were the protectors, the safety measure. So when the Lord charges Ezekiel as a watchman today, it is a weighty charge. So weighty, we learn, that if Ezekiel fails to sound the alarm for those around him and they perish in a state of wickedness, Ezekiel will be held responsible! This profound connection between God's will on earth and in heaven is repeated in today's Gospel, where Jesus instructs us that we are to be the security force, the watchers placed on alert that nowhere in the Body of Christ, the church, will there be any two members of the one Body who are not reconciled. Scripture tells us that Jesus reconciled all things in heaven and on earth through the blood of his cross. But we are given the mission to continue that reconciliation on earth as in heaven through our ceaseless efforts to be, as Paul would write, ambassadors of reconciliation. Let us not get too comfortable thinking that we are responsible only for keeping our own lives from the path of wickedness and disagreement. We are also held accountable for the lives of the members of Christ's body around us.

From the Pastor~

Next Weekend, September 16 & 17, we will take up a collection for the flood victims in Texas. As you know, Hurricane Harvey has created an unprecedented and catastrophic weather event of immense proportions. Lives have been lost and over twelve million people were under a flash flood warning with more than 24 inches of rain that fell in the Houston area alone.

Given that the President of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, His Eminence Daniel Cardinal DiNardo, the Archbishop of Galveston-Houston leads one of the dioceses most significantly affected by the hurricane, Archbishop José H. Gomez, Vice-President of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has requested that a special emergency collection to assist the victims of Hurricane Harvey be taken up in each diocese for humanitarian and church needs. Therefore, all parishes in the Diocese of Pittsburgh will take up a **second collection for these needs on the weekend of September 16 & 17.**

The funds collected in this one-time special appeal for Hurricane Harvey will be used to support the efforts of Catholic Charities USA, the official domestic relief agency of the U.S. Catholic Church, as they and their member agencies respond to immediate needs for such necessities as shelter, clean water, food, and medical care, as well as, to the long term need to rebuild and recover after widespread destruction, and to the United States Catholic Conference of Bishops for pastoral and reconstruction needs of the Church.

May our sisters and brothers in Texas experience an overwhelming generosity from us as they begin their recovery.

Also next weekend, September 16 & 17, Fr. Bruno Piccolo, PIME, will speak at all the masses as part of the diocesan -wide Mission Co-op Project.

Each year, the diocese assigns to every parish a missionary from some part of the world to share with us an understanding of Church in their region. This project helps all of us to grow in our experiences of the universality of our faith. It also provides us with an opportunity to assist the Church in her mission to further the gospel throughout the world.

The PIME Missionaries are Catholic priests and brothers who commit themselves to lifelong missionary service, especially to non-Christians. PIME stands for the Pontifical Institute for Foreign Missions in Latin. PIME, founded in Italy in 1850, is an International Society of Apostolic Life with about 500 members in 17 countries.

PIME's priority is the proclamation of the Gospel. They strive to be creative in their presence and witness as they engage in the promotion of dialogue among people of all religions and cultures. They are actively involved in human development and the promotion of justice and peace. Their ministries include the foundation of schools, hospitals and clinics, orphanages, and founding new Catholic communities and providing their pastoral care.

Due to the hurricane collection September 16 & 17, a second collection will be taken the **following** weekend, September 23 & 24, to support the mission and needs of the PIME Missionaries.

On behalf of Bishop Zubik, we welcome Fr. Bruno. May the Holy Spirit inspire us to respond generously to his appeal in spreading the Kingdom of God in the regions in which they serve.

This Thursday, September 14, is the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, the official feast day of our new school, Holy Cross Academy. All are welcome to join us at the school Mass that day at St. Sebastian Parish at 9:00 AM as we celebrate this very special day.

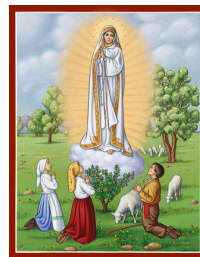
