**SAVED BY THE ONE WHO WAS REJECTED**

Some city teenagers often scorn and reject farm kids. Yet it's no exaggeration to say that humanity owes its life to farmers who care for the world's crops and livestock. This week's scriptures remind us that Jesus was as rejected as a shepherd, a farm boy, yet we owe our very lives to him.

In this Sunday's reading from the Acts of the Apostles Peter tells the people that salvation comes through Jesus Christ, the one who was rejected. In John's letter we hear that we have become God's beloved children through Jesus, whom the world did not know. Lastly, in the Gospel Jesus describes himself as the Good Shepherd who "lays down his life for the sheep" (John 10:11). Will you join Jesus in laying down your life for God's beloved flock?

A message from Deacon Jack

Since my cancer diagnosis of February 19, I have spent 40 days in the hospital, had three chemotherapy treatments, two surgeries on my throat, insertion of a blood clot filter, three blood/platelet transfusions and a bone marrow extraction. Needless to say, it has been a rather stressful time for my family. While I don't downplay the outstanding medical attention I have received, I will tell you that I have felt your prayers and they have been a key to my recovery. One of the few moments of joy during my hospitalization was when my wife would read to me the cards that more than 200 of you sent, from the children in religious education, to the Knights of Columbus, to the choir, to individual parishioners. I have felt your love and concern and appreciate it deeply. It would be impossible for me to thank you all individually for what you have done and continue to do for me. Just know that it is an honor to be associated with a faith community like St. Teresa of Avila Parish who makes every effort to live the Gospel. Thank you and know that you are all in my prayers.

**SEVENTH GRADE—FULL STREAM AHEAD!**



Wondering what this is...? HCA 7th graders can tell you!! In an exciting joint effort incorporating Science, Technology, Religion, Engineering, Art and Math, our 7th grade students

explored, researched, studied, imagined and designed viruses, in full color! As part of a challenging unit on cellular biology, students were tasked with creating a model of one of over 25 different viruses. Working under the guidance of our talented Art teacher, Mrs. Diane Pontoriero, and in conjunction with their Science teachers, Mrs. Burroway and Mr. Annis, students created 3D models of viruses such as Zika, Rhinovirus, Ebola and many others. The project-based learning unit became informational to many other students and visitors as well, as the colorful and intricate models adorned the upper hallway as a month-long art installation. Students have continued their studies of cell structure and physiology with a unit on genetics and heredity. This presented the opportunity for teachers to pull in a mathematical connection—the study of Probability—as well as connections to Religion, Art and Technology.

During Catholic Schools Week, the 7th Grade was able to explore the world of personal finance and career planning through the Junior Achievement program, *Economics for Success*. This program gives students the information needed to build strong personal finances, a cornerstone to a happy, secure life. Students learn the importance of exploring career options based on their skills, interests, and values. They also learn about spending money within a budget; saving and investing wisely; and using credit cautiously

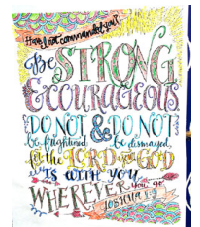
The seventh grade has also been working hard on their writing skills this year! Earlier in the year, they focused on persuasive writing, sending letters to persuade Holy Cross to make a variety of improvements, from increased course offerings to bringing back Stromboli. And... Stromboli is back! The students just finished an 8-week-long research project on animals which coordinated with the science curriculum. Students learned every aspect of the research report process—from writing fact fragment notes, to creating an outline, to citing sources properly to avoid plagiarism. No doubt, they will be very well prepared for any research project going forward!

In Faith Formation, 7th Graders are already looking ahead toward their Confirmation next year, and have worked hard on many important service projects and other special events. As Chimbote Ambassadors, our 7th-graders led the school in collecting over \$1600 for the



Diocesan mission in Chimbote, Peru. For Bring Your Bible to School Day, students created Scripture verse cards, beautifully hand-

decorated, to share with all of the homerooms in the school. The students discussed and planned this sharing of our Faith to reinforce and remind all of our faculty and student body that we are, indeed, specially blessed to have the opportunity, and the **right**, to share and express our love of God, every day, in all we do!
